

Benjamin M. Bohrer Biography

Dr. Bohrer is an assistant professor in the food science department at the University of Guelph. Dr. Bohrer began his appointment at the University of Guelph in 2016 upon completing his PhD at the University of Illinois. He grew up on his family's livestock and crop farm in Hillsboro, Ohio, USA. Dr. Bohrer's research focus covers a wide range of the meat science and muscle biology spectrum. His work focuses on evaluation of quality, yield, functionality, shelf-life, and eating experience of fresh and processed meat products. In his short career as a researcher, Dr. Bohrer has published 24 peer-reviewed journal articles, 23 scientific abstracts, and 3 short works. In addition, he has traveled to 4 countries sharing his research and passion for the meat industry as an invited speaker. Dr. Bohrer was awarded the young scholar award for the Midwest section in 2017 by the American Society of Animal Science and the Kinsman International Award in 2016 by the American Meat Science Association.
