Alison M. Duncan, Ph.D., R.D. is a Professor and Associate Director of Research at the Human Nutraceutical Research Unit, in the Department of Human Health and Nutritional Sciences at the University of Guelph. She also serves as the Research Program Director for the Food for Health Program in the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs (OMAFRA) – University of Guelph Partnership. Following an undergraduate degree in Applied Human Nutrition from the University of Guelph, she completed training to become a Registered Dietitian in Toronto, a M.Sc. in Nutritional Sciences from the University of Toronto and a Ph.D. in Nutritional Sciences from the University of Minnesota. Her current research interests relate to the biological effects of functional foods and nutraceuticals on chronic disease-related endpoints evaluated in human intervention studies, with a particular focus on the agri-food-health continuum. Alison is also part of the Agri-Food for Healthy Aging research and knowledge translation group where she collaborates in research and resource development that explore how agri-foods can improve nutrition and health in older adults. Alison has served on grant review panels in Canada and the United States, reviews manuscripts for several journals on a regular basis and currently serves on the editorial board for the Journal of Nutrition and on the Board of Directors and as Treasurer for the Canadian Nutrition Society.
